The way the 60 day grace period works is, you are given either the time remaining on your I-94 or 60 days. As long as you file a B-1/B-2 application with the government within those 60 days or 45 days depending upon your situation. You can file the application online. While this application is pending you are not accruing unlawful presence. You are in an authorized period of stay. But here is one big point to remember. If you ask for six months y But B-1/B-2 is a great way to maintain your status.
