My spouse is J-1 and is in US and I want to apply for J-2 to enter US. But 10 years back I was denied entry in US on my B1/B2 Visa with I-275 executed stamp on my passport because in my last stay in US I attended college for a semester on B1/B2 visa. So I need to ask are there chances that I will get a J-2 visa to join my spouse?

ANSWER:

It is entirely in the discretion of the consular officer whether or not to give you a J-2 visa. Impossible to predict.
